



Notice of Disposal

IMPORTANT: For your own protection you are strongly advised to positively identify the Acquirer and inform the RTA.

In the event that you are selling or disposing of your vehicle and have misplaced your 'Notice of Disposal' (back of Certificate of Registration) complete this form and return it to the Road Transport Authority, PO Box 582, Dickson ACT 2602, an Access Canberra shopfront or upload it at www.act.gov.au/askrta

Please note that where a vehicle is registered in two names, both signatures **must** appear in the Disposer's Signatures section. In the event a vehicle is registered in a company name, it is necessary for the person signing on behalf of the company to demonstrate his/her authority to dispose of the vehicle on behalf of the company.

Do not rely on the Acquirer to transfer the registration into their name. Failure to submit a notice of disposal which positively identifies the acquirer may result in you being held liable for traffic infringements or offences committed by the Acquirer. You will remain the registered operator of the vehicle until the acquirer's details are recorded by the Road Transport Authority. You should keep a copy of the completed Notice of Disposal for your own records.
